Stacey Cunningham is the President of the NYSE Group, which includes the New York Stock Exchange and a diverse range of equity and equity options exchanges, all wholly owned subsidiaries of Intercontinental Exchange (NYSE: ICE). She is the 67th President and the first woman to lead the NYSE Group in its 226 year history.

Ms. Cunningham is a respected equities industry veteran, having held senior positions in global exchanges throughout her career. Most recently, she was the NYSE Chief Operating Officer where she was responsible for NYSE's four equity markets and two options markets. In this capacity, she led the company's strategy for its equities, equity derivatives, and exchange-traded funds businesses. She also spearheaded the roll-out of NYSE's state-of-the-art trading platform, NYSE Pillar, one of the most ambitious technology programs ever completed by a global exchange.

Prior to serving as COO, Ms. Cunningham was President of NYSE Governance Services, a provider of governance, compliance, and education solutions for companies and their boards. Ms. Cunningham also served as Head of Sales & Relationship Management at NYSE where she managed the sales team for U.S. cash equities and options markets. Before joining NYSE, Ms. Cunningham held several senior positions at Nasdaq.

Ms. Cunningham began her career on the NYSE trading floor where she served as a specialist. Ms. Cunningham earned her B.S. in Industrial Engineering from Lehigh University.



Billie Jean King was named one of the "100 Most Important Americans of the 20th Century" by Life magazine and was a 2009 recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Ms. King is the founder of the Billie Jean King Leadership Initiative, the co-founder of World Team Tennis, and a member of the ownership group of the Los Angeles Dodgers and the Los Angeles Sparks. She founded the Women's Sports Foundation and the Women's Tennis Association. In August 2006, the National Tennis Center, home of the US Open, was renamed the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in honor of her accomplishments on and off the court.

In 2017, Fox Searchlight released the critically acclaimed film, *Battle of the Sexes*, which depicts the cultural and social impact of her groundbreaking match with Bobby Riggs. In 2018 Ms. King received a Lifetime Achievement Award as part of the prestigious BBC Sports Personality of the Year Awards. Ms. King serves on the board of the Women's Sports Foundation and is a past member of the board of the Elton John AIDS Foundation and a past member of the President's Council on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition.

As a tennis champion and social activist, Ms. King lives her life according to the principles of equality, empowerment, and access. She is a Visionary, Pioneer, and Legend.

Registering New Voters

The League of Women Voters of New York City was the name adopted in 1919 by the Woman Suffrage Party of New York City, whose hard work had been critical to winning the women's vote in the state in 1917. When only a minority of women registered to vote the first year, the League realized it had work to do. Members dispersed throughout the city, lecturing and holding classes about voting for women and new citizens. Over the decades, and with renewed vigor in the last three years, our members and volunteers have expanded our voter registration and education efforts to ever more diverse locations, including green markets, subways and parades, high schools and colleges, movie and Broadway theaters, corporate offices, retail stores and more. The League also trains other groups to properly carry out registration drives of their own, which multiplies the number of citizens



Publications and Art

From the beginning, the State and City Leagues have produced a variety of pamphlets, manuals and books to inform New Yorkers about who represents them, who and what is on ballots for elections, and a host of other topics related to voting and to issues for which it advocates. The highly-lauded guide to government "What Makes New York City Run?" is now available on Kindle. Other classic publications include "They Represent You," "First Vote" and "Can You Make a Difference in Your City and Country?" The League has some wonderful art going back to its early days when the banner below led suffrage parades. In the 1960s, the "Voteman" comic book character helped lead a successful registration effort in underserved neighborhoods. And in 2014, the artist Lady Pink created a spectacular, larger-than-life VOTE painting before our eyes.









Marches

What is more democratic than expressing what you believe in by marching? In its early days, the League paraded in cars and pushed baby buggies carrying signs. It continued marching with the 2014 Climate March and participated in the March for Science, the Women's Marches and the Gay Pride Parades, with volunteers helping new voters register before the marches started.








Election Information/ Debates /Advocacy

Pre-election work like candidate information and organizing debates has always been among the League's most essential services. A nonpartisan stance enhances its quality reputation. Members choose issues that matter to them and for which they want to know candidates' stances. League positions are adopted based on consensus after rigorous study. The League once had its own television program where they asked politicians about issues. Officers and members have testified often at City Hall, and the League has a bureau of speakers who will travel when invited to address issues such as the upcoming Census.
